

The Labyrinth A Prayerful Path



The labyrinth is an ancient Christian spiritual tool used for quiet reflection. Unlike a maze, a labyrinth consists of a single path to the center with no possibility of going astray.

It is a tradition of prayer that has its roots in our Judeo-Christian tradition from both Old Testament characters like Abraham and Sarah to New Testament characters like Mary, Paul, and the other disciples. The stories are told of journeys which lead to an encounter with God and back. The labyrinth tradition takes its place beside pilgrimage, retreat and the many particular disciplines of prayer.

You are invited to experience the labyrinth this Lent and reflect on your faith journey. The labyrinth is open to anybody of all ages. We invite you to bring the whole family to experience this opportunity. No, reservation is needed come when you can, and leave when you want. You must be wearing socks.

Labyrinth is located in the school gym. You may park in the teacher parking lot and enter through the doors off adjacent to Beloit Road.
